### 60.2.3 RECREATIONAL PRIVILEGES

- A. All recreational facilities on all Rutgers University campuses are available for use by students, faculty, staff, and retirees with valid identification.

- B. Camden Campus – Recreational and athletic facilities on the Camden Campus include the recreation center, gymnasium, squash/racquet ball courts, weight room, aquatic center, soccer field, and softball field and are available for use, but are subject to the scheduling requirements of the facility. The Camden Campus offers a variety of recreational programs and non-credit classes to the Rutgers–Camden community. - D. New Brunswick Campus – Recreational facilities on all New Brunswick campuses, including the Busch Tennis Bubble, College Avenue Gym, Cook/Douglass Recreation Center, Deiner Park, Easton Avenue Fitness Center, Livingston Gym, Loree Gym, Rockoff Hall Tech Gym & Spa, University Park, Sports Club Field, Class of '57 Pavilion, and Werblin Recreational Center, are available for use, but are subject to the scheduling requirements of the facility.
